The warrant will include a proposal for the town to adopt a charter form of government that would change and modernize the organizational structure and operation of local government.

A Quick Primer on the Charter

The charter proposal, developed over the past several months by a 12-member advisory committee appointed by the Select Board, is designed to:

- Make town government more professional, effective and responsive
- Improve efficiency, accountability, customer service and citizen participation
- Retain open town meeting and other key aspects of the current government structure
- Create a strong town manager role to serve as chief administrative officer and direct day-to-day operations
- Reduce costs through increased efficiency, tighter fiscal controls, and better utilization of staff and resources
- Enable the Select Board to focus on policy and broad, high-impact issues

As always with town meeting, the charter adoption decision rests with the voters. Come be part of the democratic process on an issue that will shape the town's future: **Monday, January 12 at 7 p.m. at the town hall.**
